

Waldringfield Primary School – Swimming Summary 2019

Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<p>All children in KS2 have received swimming lessons as part of curriculum time since they were in Year 3 at various times.</p> <p>Our current Year 4/5 class swam every week in curriculum time for the Autumn term.</p> <p>Our current Year 2/3 class swam every week in curriculum time for the Spring term, with an extra half an hour session due to sports premium.</p> <p>Year 6 can all swim 25 meters successfully, including children with SEND.</p> <p>2018-19 cohort of Year 6 = 100% achievement of statutory swimming requirements.</p> <p>Currently 3 members of school staff have achieved their shallow water certificate and support lessons at the pool.</p> <p>We have close links with Waldringfield Sailing Club, using real world examples of water safety (Year 6 sailing day) and our locality means that swimming and water safety is of importance here.</p>	<p>Assessment and baseline understanding of the younger children in our school and their swimming ability as they move into Key Stage Two.</p> <p>Can we provide extra swimming as part of our Sports Premium offer in the future? Would this be sustainable?</p>

Meeting national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety	Percentages:
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?	94%
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]?	94%
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	94%
